We are currently updating the information that is available to you to help you understand the curriculum content for each subject area. Over the next couple of weeks, we will share with you the updated subject specific documents with improved information on how we teach the subject across the school.

Healthy Snacks and Lunchboxes

As many of you will be aware we have been working on improving our healthy school 'status' and focusing on snacks at breaktimes. We have been adding information to the newsletter, talking about this in assembly and talking to children about healthy lunchboxes at lunchtimes over the last few months.



Following a meeting with our school parliament representatives and a long discussion on how we can continue to promote healthy lifestyles, including what the government guidance says, it was voted by the overwhelming majority that from the new year, we are asking children to only bring in either a piece of fresh fruit, dried fruit, or some vegetables like carrot sticks. This does not include any variations of manufactured or processed fruits (for example fruit winders or fruit bars).

We will of course have a period of adjustment where, up until February half term, if children bring in a snack that is not in line with this guidance, they will be reminded about the new healthy snacks procedure but can able to have their snack that day. After February half term, children will be asked to take the snack home and be offered a piece of school fruit as an alternative. All of KS1 and Reception children are already provided with fruit daily, but unfortunately some children currently choose not to eat this as they bring their own 'more favourable' snacks in to school.

The Pupil Parliament also voted to continue with offering toast but to end the hot chocolate for sale at break times, as this doesn't promote healthy habits and they were clear they wanted the message to be consistent and fair across school.

We hope that you respect this decision, made by the children with the full support of school. This is in line with many other school snack procedures as we are keen to promote healthy habits and healthy lifestyles. We continue to support children in bringing in healthy lunchboxes and the high majority bring in a fabulous balanced and healthy meal choice. Notes will be sent home should a child's lunchbox not be in line with our healthy eating practice.

Library and Reading Volunteers

If anyone would be interested in becoming a library volunteer for a couple of hours each week to help us run the school library and oversee the organisation of books, please let us know. We are also still looking for parents/family members who can spare some time each week to come in to school and listen to the children read - our children love sharing books and reading to adults in school. School Uniform

We still have a lot of unnamed uniform and lost property. This has been building up over the last term. If it is not collected then it will need to go to a recycling bank due to a lack of space in school. We always have free school uniform available in the foyer if anyone would like to recycle, re-use and do their bit for the planet too!

Please please label all uniform, including woolly hats and gloves - we have a rather large collection!

Y4 - Multiplication Check Information

In Year 4, children have a statutory times table test (the Multiplication Table Check) in the summer term. Children are tested on the iPad or computer with 25 questions, and they have 6 seconds per question before it automatically goes onto the following question. Therefore it is important that children feel as confident as possible answering the questions at the given speed.



As a school we log onto TT Rockstars weekly, checking how frequently the children are using the website and which times tables they know or need to learn, therefore we would really appreciate your support in encouraging your child to use this as much as possible.

To prepare for this in school, we do....

- 1 morning of TT Rockstars practice (8.40-9am)
- Monday and Friday lunchtimes 12-12.30 children have the opportunity to stay in the classroom and practice on TT Rockstars or Timestables.co.uk
- Weekly times table lesson (Friday) where children are taught times tables and given time to learn/practice ones they are unsure of
- Daily Fluent 5 questions where multiplication questions are included Three weekly arithmetic style paper/questions are used in the classroom where multiplication questions are included
- Miss Broadbent runs a intervention group for times tables on a Monday and Wednesday 12- 12.15
- Zapper times table activities on a Tuesday (8.40-9am)

To prepare for this at home, you can...


- Encourage children to use TT Rockstars and Timestables.co.uk as much as possible
- Complete weekly Maths homework (which will have a multiplication focus as of week commencing 15.1.24
- Ensure children practice for their weekly times table test
- Review the children's heatmaps from TT Rockstars, which will show the exact times tables the children are struggling with and need to learn (being sent out week commencing 15.1.24)

Useful websites are TT Rockstars and Timestables.co.uk (this one can be used to set 25 questions in 6 seconds like the real thing).
